


TRAMOYA

SUDDENLY A COMEDY

With 'Juan Salvador Tramoya' the Chilean Spanish French company La Mona Ilustre (Los Peces No Vuelan, Las Cosas También Tienen Mamá) presents the imagination of a character-stagehand, whose daily job is cleaning a theater dressing room.

The show is a tragicomic and Chaplinesque tinged delirium, in which the gesture game and laughter tell us about the subtle and important difference between what they say we should be and what we really are. Juan Salvador Tramoya presents the apparent routine of a character with the sole and simple task of tidying up things, but whose rich imagination transports us to absurd and unexpected places, making us get into what he really is, a valuable and inimitable human being.




JUAN SALVADOR TRAMOYA



Here is the story of a good-for-nothing who can turn fuzzy dust into pigeons and is unable to crush a mosquito friend. It is the story of a tiny brain full of strange planets, bubblegum balloons, monster bosses. A silent story framed in unusual imaginary landscapes. Places where a leak may flood a room from which we must swim out, universes in which one can fall from the moon, where one previously climbed to on a stage ladder...

This is the world of Juan Tramoya, who takes care of a theater as far as he can remember A man with a vivid imagination, which nobody notices. An invisible being who wants to be an actor, but was born as clumsy as a doorknob... Born stagehand, like his father, like his grandfather. Juan Salvador Tramoya is a tragicomic fable about who we are what we want to be and what we can be. It is the epic, comic deed of a simple man who wants to fly.

Juan Salvador works as a stagehand in a theater. He tidies tidies and tidies. He tidies a dressing room, handkerchiefs, cotton, brushes Juan Salvador gets confused: he imagines that handkerchiefs are pigeons, and cotton becomes bombs in his hands. From tidying and imagining so much the dressing room suddenly turns into the moon, the sea, or a gloomy mansion. Juan Salvador lives, in his imagination. wonderfully absurd adventures that do not always have a happy ending and almost always end up causing a disaster when getting back to reality. Juan Salvador gets disappointed, and keeps tidying as directed. Will Juan Salvador make the dressing room clean? Can he live up to the insistent calls from his boss? Can he put aside his imagination and return to work?



'Directed by the spanish Miguel Bregante, 'Juan Salvador Tramoya' is an attractive and laughing burlesque spectacle. And it's also the way for Diego Hinojosa - remarcable old student of the rigorous La Mancha school - makes shine his talents of clown.'
